About the Program

Led by academics from the University of Oxford and Cambridge and practitioners of human rights, our International Human Rights Law program will challenge high school students as they grapple with contemporary issues in the sphere of Human Rights. This program combines a historical perspective, an analysis of the institutional framework, and real-world case studies to provide inquisitive students with a deep understanding of the nature of the legal application of Human Rights.

Over the 2-week course, students work in a mentor-led group to delve further into current issues in International Human Rights to develop their understanding and analysis of problems facing the world today and the legal instruments to combat them.

Finally, students will also learn key skills associated with the historic teaching style of Cambridge & Oxford Universities which will culminate in an end-of-program project presentation judged by an eminent academic.

The cherry on top, with a designated session focused on applications and interviews, this program will also give students the mindset needed to deal with uncertainty and the confidence to know that they can apply to any elite institution around the world – including Oxford and Cambridge.

International Human Rights Law

- Lecture: Introduction to Human Rights

 Primer on human rights and encompassing scope of study.
- Project Introduction: Debate patterned on Model United Nations
 In groups, students debate a topic related to Human Rights. In the past, groups have debated "Sports & Human Rights" and "COVID19's impact on Freedom".
- Seminar: Historic Milestones in Human Rights Law Development

 From the Magna Carta to World War II: looking at how human rights have been shaped by events.
- Seminar: How are International Human Rights Enforced?

 Enforcement strategies of different countries differences/similarities.
- Case Study: Key Case/s before the ICC

 Students will look at major cases that have been presented before the International Criminal Court and discuss their implications.
- Seminar: The role of NGOs in International Human Rights
 What are NGOs? How do they affect International Human Rights?
- Seminar: How Universal is the Universal Declaration of Human Rights?

 A session focused on engendering debate around whether the Universal Declaration of Human Rights is indeed universal.
- Seminar: Biggest challenges for International Human Rights law today
 Greatest obstacles for Human Rights on the International stage today. What can we do?





Team Project - Model United Nations Debate

- Students will be divided into teams.
- Formulation of motion. Motions will be related to an international human rights issue.
- Teams will argue either for or against the motion.
- After conducting intensive guided research work, the teams will present their arguments on the final day to a panel of distinguished judges.

Delivery Structure

- 1.5 hours of delivery everyday.
- 30 minutes everyday to review previous classes + work on project.
- Focus on different aspects of debating.
- Learner centric model with plenty of space and time for questions.





Awards Ceremony & Graduation



On the last day of this program, all teams will get to present their projects which will be followed by an award ceremony, recognising and appreciating the best projects.

It will then be followed by a graduation ceremony where all the students will be given their program certificates.
