Harvard Debate League is a **4 day offline** workshop designed to equip high school students with essential debate skills through a comprehensive and interactive curriculum.

Starting with an introduction to various debate formats and fundamentals, students will learn to construct cases, develop strong arguments, and practice rebuttals. Advanced sessions will cover deeper argumentation techniques, cross-examination, and strategic planning. Specialized skills like **persuasion, public speaking, and team dynamics** are also emphasized.

The program culminates in a **competitive tournament**, allowing students to showcase their skills, receive feedback, and be recognized for their achievements.
